1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance
Dick Dunning called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

2. Points of Pride

Dr. Kimberly Saunders shared various Points of Pride as reported to her by administrators.

Dan Harper reported that he ran a relay in support of "Veteran's Count" along with several staff members. Dick Dunning reported that the South Meadow School band played in Peterborough and veterans were pleased to have the band back.

3. Approval of Manifests (Board Vote Required)

Kimberly Saunders certified that manifests listed totaling \$1,839,041.89 have been reviewed by her and found to be proper charges against the Contoocook Valley School District for goods and/or services received and have been properly processed prior to their submittal to the School Board.

William Bryk moved to approve the Manifests as read. Greg Kriebel second. Unanimous.

4. Public Comment

Angela Pape, Peterborough, spoke about early wake ups being a difficult transition. Her children do not get enough sleep. Research is clear that later start times lead to better academic performance. She referenced scores shared at the last school board meeting. Sleep will help students learn better. Two states have passed laws relative to start times for middle school and high school. She is motivated by evidence for athletic performance. Sleep improves athletic and academic outcomes.

Later start times reduce traffic accidents. Studies show that sleep deprivation impairs teens. She urged moving start times back. The issue will benefit kids and families in the district.

Sierra Pape, 5th grade student at SMS, shared what time she needs to catch the bus. She shared what happens to her when she does not get enough sleep. She reported that her classmates put their heads down in class to get more sleep. Miss Pape said that a later start time would be better for everyone. She urged changing the start time of school to one hour later.

Naomi Tucker, Peterborough, 5th grade parent, referenced test scores shared at the last board meeting noting a sharp fall in test scores at the middle school level.

She said that she has been thinking about early start times as another contributor. Moving start times by even one hour later may change test scores favorably.

Light impacts how humans perceive the length of the day.

She asked that we use what we know to positively impact students. She acknowledged the board for all that they do for our communities.

5. Reports

a. Student Representative – Lucy Jackson

Lucy Jackson reported that there were 20 new members inducted into the National Honor Society recently. Officers shared speeches on the four pillars. This week is a week of service in the communities. Lucy shared various activities scheduled. Next week, students will share what they are grateful for.

The ConVal Craft Fair will be held this Saturday. This Friday is the date set to apply to NH Universities for free.
